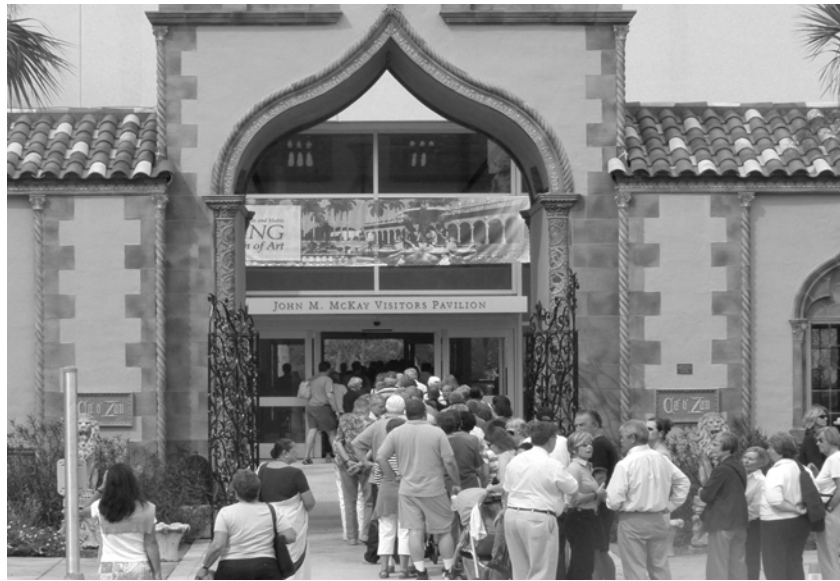
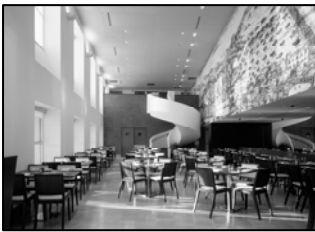


JOHN M. MCKAY VISITORS PAVILION



The John M. McKay Visitors Pavilion provides a grand and gracious entrance to the Ringling estate. Visitors enter through the restored *Cà d'Zan* gate and are welcomed in an elegant foyer with well-equipped amenities. The facility includes:



- Gracious and accommodating admissions area for the Ringling estate and Historic Asolo Theatre
- Orientation area with introductory video
- Special entrance for school groups
- The Treviso restaurant and Museum Store to accommodate visitor needs
- The jewel of this building is the fully-restored Historic Asolo Theater, considered one of the most beautiful and intimate performance spaces in America
