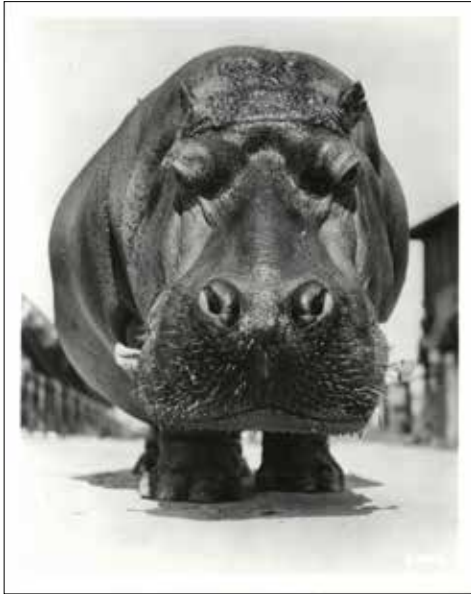

A SPLENDID SIGHT IN THE SUNLIGHT: ENCOUNTERING INDIA AT THE AMERICAN CIRCUS

The grand, spectacular pageantry of the railroad circuses of this era bore a striking similarity to the ceremonial processions and royal rituals in India during the Mughal and colonial British periods. This talk by Janet M. Davis will explore these Indian influences on the American circus. Additionally, circus spectacles, such as "Oriental India" and the "Durbar of Delhi," introduced American audiences to Indian dance traditions, yoga, pluralistic religious rituals, textile design, and exotic animals, thus demonstrating the power of the circus to offer its audiences a glimpse of the world beyond provincial borders.

Janet M. Davis is Professor of American Studies and History at the University of Texas at Austin. She regularly serves as a humanities consultant, most recently for the award-winning documentary miniseries, "The Circus," which aired nationally on PBS in 2018 and is now streaming on Netflix.

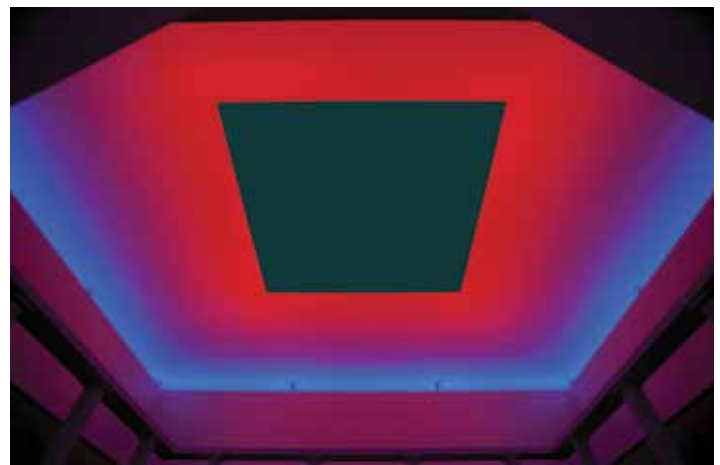
