Summary The Ringling Members Council Records is represented in "A

Guide to the Archives of the John and Mable Ringling Museum of

Art," 1994. Here it is listed as a series (MC, series 02) in the Museum Records Collection under Committee and Council

Records. The Ringling Members Council Records are arranged in two categories; Meetings and Administrative Records. The records consist of Members Council operating files, meeting minutes, correspondences, administrative and financial files, directories and handbooks, governance records and event files. There are three Gravel Awards for "Best Continuing Project." The official name in the articles of incorporation of 1965 is the Member's Council of the John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art, Inc.

Administrative Information

Provenance

The Ringling Members Council (RMC) Records were kept by various council members and presidents. At the discretion of the creators, these records were stored by the Ringling Museum. When the Archives was formed in 1991, the stored records were transferred to the custody of the Archives. The transfer of records to the Archives consisted of administrative files and event files for the period 1967-1985, along with three awards. In 2017, additional records were brought to the Archives by RMC president, Jim LeTellier. The date range for the records, brought by LeTellier, is 1958-2017, with the bulk from 1999-2012.

Information about Access

The Records of the Ringling Museum Council may be viewed by appointment. Use of certain materials is restricted by statute, by the office of origin, or by the donor. For the protection of its collections, the Archives also reserves the right to restrict access to records which are not arranged, are being processed, or are exceptionally valuable or fragile. In some cases, copies may be substituted for the originals.

2012 RMC 501(c)(3) status dissolved to resolve tax issues. Articles of dissolution filed on August 20th. RMC seeks to "Transform" into the "Ringling Members Advisory Council (RMAC)."

2017 RMC articles of dissolution are effective May 23rd.

Historical Note

The Members Council of the John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art, Inc., referred to as the Ringling Members Council (RMC), was governed by a Members Council Board of Directors to support the John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art. As stated in "A Guide to the Archives of the John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art: The State Art Museum of Florida," the primary aims of this volunteer organization was to increase its community participation in the activities of the Museum, to aid the Director and staff, to help financially in areas where State funds were not available, and to promote the Museum (Walk, 1994). To support the Museum, the RMC conducted fundraising activities to pay for special programs. In 1957 the first fundraiser was held, *Mozart's opera, Abduction from the Seraglio*. Significant records exist for the Art Carnival, Christmas at *Cà d'Zan*, the Craft Festival (ended in 1992) and Medieval Fair. Membership events include the Children's Art Carnival, exhibition receptions and hospitality, concerts, Monday Morning Coffees, lectures and speaker's bureau, Candlelight Dinners, and tours.

The RMC was incorporated in 1958 and dissolved in 2017. The RMC developed membership and related programs and renewals. During the period 1985-1992, under Museum Director, Laurence Ruggiero, the relation of the Members Council with the Museum was strained. The role of the Members Council was changed and transferred to Museum staff. In 1992, the new Museum Director, David Ebitz, sought to rebuild the relationship with the Members Council. In 2000, when the Ringling Museum of Art was brought under the stewardship of Florida State University, the RMC was not included. When the IRS changed tax requirements for 501(c)(3) organizations in 2008, the RMC sought to transform itself. In 2012, the RMC filed articles of dissolution and engaged in transforming itself into the Ringling Members Advisory Council. On May 23, 2017 the articles of dissolution were effective and the RMC was dissolved.

Scope and Content Note

As an auxiliary organization, the files of RMC were deposited with the Archives at the discretion of the RMC president. Due to this, there are significant gaps in the collection. The bulk of the material dates from 1999-2012. There are event record dating from the late 1960s to 1980s, and scant records of the 1950s, 1990s and after 2012.

This collection is divided into two categories. The first category, Meetings, contains meeting agendas, minutes, and correspondences of the RMC, RMC Board of Directors, the Board of Trustees, Ringling Museum of Art Foundation, Inc., the Board of Directors and various Museum committees.

The second category, Administrative Records, contains correspondences, directories, governance records, histories, manuals and handbooks and other office documents. The committees and groups section holds limited records of the Advisory Council, Docent Advisory Council (DAC), Friends of the Ringling Museum, the Hospitality Committee; and the Informal Activities Group. There are handbook and manuals from the Board of Directors, RMC, Florida State University Ringling Center, the Ringling Museum of Art Foundation, Inc., and the Board of Directors Manual. Additionally, there are files pertaining to the business affairs of the Ringling Museum of Art including exhibition schedules, membership development, and reports. Records for events and programming that the RMC was responsible for or involved with from 1966-2009 are held in the collection. The bulk of event and programming material dates from the 1970s to the 1980s. There are three Gravel Awards that were awarded to the RMC by the Sarasota Herald-Tribune in 1979, 1980 and 1983.
